The History of One Great Hour of Sharing

In 1946, Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill of the Episcopal Church challenged members to raise "one million dollars in one hour." It worked!

In 1949, church leaders from several denominations formed an ad hoc committee to organize an appeal on major radio networks and many independent radio stations. The participants included President Harry Truman who brought greetings and a cast of the foremost dramatic and musical talent of the day.

The broadcast ended with a request that listeners attend their local church the following morning and make a sacrificial contribution for those around the globe who had urgent needs, due to war, famine or natural disaster. No exact measure of income was possible though it was estimated more than 75,000 churches participated.

Something Bigger Than Ourselves

We always live with the temptation to see ourselves and our personal concerns as the center of the universe. That temptation only intensifies in times of stress, whether that stress comes from our own unique challenges, or whether it is a function of turbulence in the larger society around us.

Those of us whose memories stretch back a few years or decades can testify that the lost jobs and melting savings of the current economy are nothing new. Many in our congregation remember the great depression of the 1930s vividly. Threats and saber rattling among nations are not unique to our time either. We have veterans of World War II, the Korean War and Vietnam in our midst, and current members and loved ones deployed to Iraq. The "*wars and rumors of wars*" of *Matthew 24* seem to me to be not simply a sign of "the end times", but a mark of the fallen human condition. The anxiety around global climate change is a function of real challenges to which Christians of all people – aware of the Creator's mandate to exercise stewardship of the earth – ought to be responsive, but earthquakes, hurricanes, typhoons and catastrophic droughts have threatened human survival since the beginning of time. And finally, I would never minimize the searing grief of a loved one lost; I have been there myself. But the sting of death and grief are inescapable if we live and love.

If we never break out of the iron cell of self-concern, we will forever be prisoners of life's circumstances, and we will never see beyond the horizon

of the self. Jesus issues us an exhilarating promise wrapped in a challenge. "*If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it (Mark 8:34-35).*"

This is not a grim invitation to masochism, but a courageous call to see beyond one's self and to believe and live from the conviction of a new world coming. When we teach our children, offer hospitality to our neighbors, visit those who are sick and in prison, freely and genuinely forgive those who have wronged us, wish our enemies well, tithe off the top of our income, and praise God ***in all things***, we are liberated from deadening self concern, and we become living signs of something bigger than ourselves, that new world in which "*the earth will be full of the knowledge of God as the waters cover the sea*" (*Isaiah 11:9*).

It is a special invitation, then, from a gracious God, that this year, when household budgets are tight and the local church budget is stretched and we are threatened by paralyzing anxiety, we are invited to look beyond ourselves to those who have been victims of war and natural disaster through the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering. See the accompanying historical vignette about this offering, which American Baptists raise and distribute jointly with sister churches. Paradoxically, it is God's gift to us.
