



"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." (1 Peter 2:9, NIV)

When people ask me my religion, I tell them I am "a Christian first, a Baptist second, and an American Baptist third." I have good reason to answer the question in that way and in that order, and I would challenge everyone to think about how they would answer the same question.

Recently, we held a "Church 101" course for a group of new members who are joining First Baptist Church. As a pastor, one of the best parts of my job is to talk with new people about their faith journey and welcome them into our church family.

Part of Church 101 involves sharing with new members our Church Constitution and Bylaws. When we hand them those documents, I always joke with them, saying that it is "light bedtime reading." When people think of interesting things to read, Church Constitutions and Bylaws usually do NOT come to mind!

However, as it turns out, they are incredibly important! They spell out the basic beliefs of a church, provide a framework for their specific mission, and set forth the sort of polity that will guide church leadership in carrying out the Great Commission of Jesus in their unique context.

One of the most important features of FBC's constitution is the section that outlines our 7 core principles. This quarter, we will be taking time as a congregation to acquaint or perhaps reacquaint ourselves with those core values, which are important not only for us, but have been important for Baptists historically, for hundreds of years. They include historic Baptist distinctives and themes, such as: Regenerate church membership, the priesthood of all believers, believer's baptism by immersion, biblical authority, spiritual democracy, separation of Church and State, and the Christian's responsibility in the world. We don't often think about it today, but these are vital, biblical concepts for which our Baptist forbears risked their own lives and for which some even paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Have you ever wondered why FBC operates the way we do? Have you ever wondered what we have believed historically? Have you ever wondered what being Baptist is all about? Have you ever wondered what being an American Baptist is all about? Then I invite you to come and learn more as we explore what it means to "become a person of principles" this fall!





Jesus Is Worthy of All our Praise

I will bless the Lord at all times: His praise shall continually be in my mouth. (Psalm 34:1)

con·tin·u·al, adj. - Recurring regularly or frequently. Not interrupted; steady.

EXPRESS GRATITUDE TO GOD. The most effective way to utilize our words is to exalt and honor the Lord. We can cultivate a habit of focusing on things that are praiseworthy and directing our attention to the One who truly deserves praise—Jesus. There have been instances when I lost sight of my priorities and ended up magnifying and obsessing over my problems. However, King David understood the significance of merely glancing at his difficulties and instead fixing his gaze upon God, recalling His goodness, and continuously blessing Him!

APPRECIATE GOD'S PROVISION. "Those who seek the Lord will lack no good thing" (Psalm 34:10b). Jesus taught that as we prioritize seeking God's kingdom and righteousness, all the necessary things will be provided for us—shelter, food, clothing, and the fundamental provisions of life that God cares about and supplies (Matthew 6:33).

O taste and see that the Lord is good (*Psalm 34:8a*).

EXPERIENCE GOD'S GOODNESS. We can cherish God's Word, just as Jeremiah proclaimed, "Thy words were found, and I did eat them; and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart" (Jeremiah 15:16a). When we take time to internalize God's Word in our hearts, our priorities and lives align with God's plan, and we witness His abundant goodness.

Collective Worship

We use the word WORSHIP a lot! But do we understand the implications it has for our lives in Christ?

I'm stilling learning about WORSHIP, and I've been trying to do it for the past 40 years...

Worship (noun) is what God expects from those who believe in Him for Salvation. Worship (verb) is what I do when I pray, read my Bible, encourage other Christians, give my money, time and resources to God's work, and when I lift my voice in praise to Him.

During the week I worship God mostly privately. But come Sunday, God expects me to participate in community worship or "collective worship". God loves it when His people come together to worship Him.

However ... Are we worshiping collectively on Sundays, or are we worshiping privately?

Each of us will answer that question differently.

During the next few months, let God challenge you to worship with others during Sunday mornings. Sit somewhere different in the sanctuary... near someone you may not know. Get to know them, and deliberately join them in worship. Reach out to someone new before and/or after the service. Pray with someone. Listen to a new story from a new life. Discover how you might pray for and help someone.

Collective worship IS different. Give collective worship a try on Sunday mornings if you haven't yet done so. See what happens!

Also, there was a representative of MMBB who joined us for a financial presentation as well. Our final guest was Dr. Russel Yeung, a leading sociologist of Asian Americans, race, and religion. 
The Prayer Corner with Richard McGuirk

"Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here, while I go over there and pray." (Matthew 26:36, ESV)
