A new year brings with it an opportunity to look at what God calls us to do with fresh vision and a renewed passion for the Gospel. Recently, I've been reflecting on the various ways people can connect with the ministry of First Baptist Church of Portland, whether they are long-time members or brand-new visitors. It can be intimidating especially for a newer person to really connect with a church family that has a history as long as First Baptist.

As I've pondered this with some of our staff and leaders, we have really come to the conclusion there are four primary ways in which people can get connected at First Baptist, four "onramps" if you will. Read on to learn about each one:

1. LIFE GROUPS

Through our Life Groups we show our commitment to growth (Luke 10: 38–42). These small group Bible studies meet at different times, in different places, and in different ways (in-person or online). Our hope is to provide every way necessary for people to connect with a small group of folks to develop friendships, pray for each other, and study the Bible together. Our Life Group ministry resumes the week after January 14, 2024. Join us at 11:00 am on

Tuesdays at the church for our *Prayer Life Group*. Or, join us at 7:00 pm on Wednesdays for our *Sermon-Based Life Groups* that happen both on Portland's East Side and West Side. 2. MONTHLY FELLOWSHIP MEALS

Through our Monthly Fellowship Meals, we show our *commitment to one another* (1 Corinthians 11: 17–34). Usually (but certainly not always) on the third Sunday of each month, these are great opportunities to make new friends, catch up with old friends, and just enjoy an uplifting time of fellowship. 3. SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES

Through our Sunday Worship Services, we show our *commitment to God* (Hebrews 10:19–25). As you may recall, we are splitting the English worship service

into two main components, called the "Classical Service" and the "Celebration Service." Here's how things will work each week as we begin 2024:

Classical Service (10:30 am) For those who prefer traditional styles of worship (the great old hymns, responsive readings, a Bible-based message, a more liturgical approach to worship, and the ability to get to lunch by noon), this is for you! It starts at 10:30 am every Sunday and then goes until about 11:10 am. Feel free to head on into your day, or stay on for the Celebration service!

Celebration Service (11:00 am) For those who prefer non-traditional styles of worship (guitars, drums, and a more free-flowing approach to worship, along with a Bible-based message), this is for you. It starts at about 11:00 am every Sunday and usually goes until about noon. Yep, you'll notice that there is an overlap between the Classical Service and the Celebration Service. That's because we want to encourage worshippers of all varieties to have the opportunity to mingle together. In fact, although you are welcome to not arrive until 11am, we also encourage you to check out the Classical Service that happens beforehand. 4. DROP-IN

Through Drop-In, we show our *commitment to the* community (Matthew 6:1-4). For over forty years, this outreach ministry of our church has fed thousands of people, distributed tons of food and clothing, and helped countless individuals find their way out of life

on the street and/or come to faith in Christ. Drop-In, which is open 2:00 – 4:00 pm every Monday and Thursday, along with the Resource Center, is one of the most accessible ministries to those who live in our neighborhood, whether they are in need of material help, or are just looking for a sense of community and a place to belong. As we start this New Year, we want to invite everyone to join us for church, regardless of which of the four "onramps" above work for you! Embrace the New Year with Confidence

Let your character [your moral essence, your inner nature] be free from the love of money [shun greed—be financially ethical], being content with what you have; for He has said, "I will never [under any circumstances] desert you [nor give you up nor leave you without support, nor will I in any degree leave you helpless], nor will I forsake or let you down or relax My hold on you [assuredly not]!" So we take comfort and are encouraged and confidently say, "The Lord is my Helper [in time of need], I will not be afraid. What will man do to me?" Hebrews 13:5–6 (AMP)

I. GOD IS WITH YOU. You are not alone. I love the verse above – it talks about being free from preoccupation with material things and instead trusting the source of your provision – God – who will never fail you. The most precious treasure in our lives is our relationship with God. Let's get enthusiastic about Him and sow daily toward this wonderful connection.

II. GOD IS ON YOUR SIDE. "The Lord is on my side; I will not fear. What can [mere] man do to me?" (Psalm 118:6 AMP). God did not send Jesus into the world to condemn or reject us, but so we might find salvation and be made safe and sound through Him (John 3:17).

III. GOD IS IN YOU. "He who is in you is greater than he (Satan) who is in the world [of sinful mankind]" (1 John 4:4b AMP). There are over 100 verses on being "in Christ" or "Christ in us" – take time to study this wonderful truth!

IV. GOD IS UPON YOU. "The Lord will rise upon you and His glory will appear upon you" (Isaiah 60:2). When God's presence gets on us, things change. People could tell that John and Peter had been with Jesus (Acts 4:13).

This is what it's all about – being filled with the Spirit and going out and being His witnesses (Acts 1:8).

V. GOD IS BESIDE YOU. "The Lord stands beside me like a great warrior" (Jeremiah 20:11a NLT). There's an invincibility to the tone of this. He is right there beside you, so you will not be moved (Psalm 16:8).

VI. GOD IS BENEATH YOU. "The eternal God is a hiding place, and underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deuteronomy 33:27a). God is a safety net for us. He's not doing fake trust falls. He is the solid rock, the chief cornerstone, the eternal stable one, who is abiding and present in your situation.

VII. GOD GOES BEFORE YOU. "You have enclosed me behind and before, And [You have] placed Your hand upon me." (Psalm 139:5 AMP). God does more than stay a step or two ahead. He dwells in eternity and knows more about the future and the end of a thing than we do about the beginning.

VIII. GOD HAS YOUR BACK. "You will not leave in a hurry, running for your lives. For the Lord will go ahead of you; yes, the God of Israel will protect you from behind (Isaiah 52:12 NLT). Another translation calls Him "your rear guard" (NKJV). Having a rear guard is important because the devil loves to bring up past failures and sins to us. But the blood of Jesus has truly cleansed us and given us a fresh, new beginning. You can trust God, stand on His promises, and go into the new year with confidence, knowing that Jesus has your back!

Thank you, Lord, regardless of what happens to my body I can win this battle with cancer, whether I live or die. I am willing to pay the ultimate price. I give you my life, Lord.

Furthermore, I have been granted the privilege of suffering for the sake of Jesus Christ. I should be willing to suffer for his sake. I give God, the Father, thanks for allowing me the privilege of learning what suffering truly is. If I can learn to wait and trust God, there will be some miraculous things to give him, such as: Thanksgiving, a complete relationship with God, and intimacy with God during times of trial.

Another thing to be thankful for during suffering is hope. My hope comes from this scripture. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?" (Psalm 22:1). We see Jesus on the cross asking the same question in Matthew 27: 46. "And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" I have never really understood that question until I dealt with cancer. Thank you, God, for a deep meaning of those words. Why have you forsaken me? The answer to that question is that you have been with me all along. That is all I asked when I was diagnosed with cancer for a second time. I wanted Father God to walk with me. I could die of cancer and still win the battle. If my faith is strong, I must have an impact in the community on my knees before God to beat cancer.

Finally, my desire is to please God in my suffering from cancer. I hope I showed my faith, hope, thanksgiving, and love. Thank you, Church, during my suffering. My community took my battle for me. I am indebted to you forever. I am thankful for First Baptist Church of Portland, and I love the body of First Baptist Church of Portland.

Our Cambodian ministry resumed the Zoom Bible study right after Labor Day and ended in October before the holiday season and the Cambodian mission trip. I want to thank Rev. Felicia Keo and Mrs. Elizabeth Khem for their help in conducting these Bible studies. We again resume in 2024, right after the New Year's Day.

Our mission trip team missed the Thanksgiving celebration, but our Cambodian ministry was joyfully involved with the worship service and the excellent meal for Thanksgiving. I am grateful to the Lord that Rev. Felicia Keo gave the sermons during my absence from the mission trip. I also want to thank God for Cambodian leaders who faithfully engaged in the ministry to ensure that nothing came short of meeting the needs of the ministry while we went on the mission trip. God is working miraculously in our church, and the Cambodian Children Ministry has become a part of our mission. You have been praying and supporting this ministry as it grows and bears fruits for His kingdom.

There were 22 members of our Cambodian ministry who joined the Khmer Christian Pacific of the Northwest. On December 17, our church family came to celebrate Cambodian Christmas with your joyful hearts to hear the mission trip report and the testimonials from the team members as well. I hope you enjoyed a gift from the Children's Center as a token of their thanks for your prayers and support. I also hope you delight in the Christmas

fellowship and the Cambodian foods prepared by our best cooks, who always enjoy serving our God when given the opportunity. Special thanks to the kitchen team! And we thank you for the Christmas love gift toward the ministry's 2024 budget.

Here are the highlights of the mission trip.

As you know, five of us in the mission team packed up a lot of ministry supplies for the Children's Center, including clothes for children, laptops for pastors and computer class, flashlights, over-the-counter medications, power tools to fix buildings, etc. We executed the plans for the trip based on our precise itinerary, which was slightly different from the previous trip, and it was an inspired and exciting trip with life-changing elements even though it faced health challenges.

For the first part, we went to Siem Reap Province for an Angkor Wat tour, floating villages, a night market, and

a special dinner with Khmer traditional dance performances. As you may know, Angkor Wat is one of the world's ten wonders. We always need more sightseeing each time we visit that amazing, ancient architecture. I learn something new each time I lead the team members through. After

we gained energy from the long flight and stayed at the Smiling Hotel in Siem Reap Province, we continued to the Children's Center, which was our primary purpose.

The second part of the trip was to work at the Children's Center. We took in the fresh countryside air of Kampong Chhnang Province and received a warm welcome from the people in the Center. We stayed at the Sovann Phum Hotel in the main Province and came to work at the Center during the daytime. There was a different working schedule each day. For the early part of the day, we went grocery shopping with the chef to feed the children and congregation. About 250 people joined our Thanksgiving dinner, and a gift was given to each person. Then, we visited the poor families to determine how we would help their families, such as with medical or clothing needs, or even rebuild their homes and a well for the welfare of their health.

After the visits, we started to rebuild their homes according to our evaluation. We continued to build our relationship with children and help them to share the gospel. We also helped clean up the Center with the children. We wanted the children to know that we were there because of the love of Jesus and that we were all God's children. We encouraged them to live and serve our God and prayed with them and their leaders. We thank our team members for being patient with Shirley and me while interviewing and meeting with newly hired staff to work in the Center and meeting with other potential church leaders as well. There were ten people who committed their lives to Christ and were baptized!

For the third part of the trip, we went to Phnom Penh and stayed there for the first night, and the following day, we took off on a tour trip to Da Nang in Vietnam for four days and three nights through the buses and flights from Ho Chiming to Da Nang Province. It was the first time for the Cambodian pastor and the rest of our team members. Shirley and I have been to Vietnam several times. Most of our team members got used to the Cambodian culture and foods but not to the Vietnamese. It was a humble experience to learn about their lifestyle in the city and the countryside, especially in their tour sites. We met people from different religions worldwide and visited Da Nang's tour sites. Riding cable cars back and forth from one mountain to another and riding a three-boat at the Hoi An ancient city were exciting experiences for us all.

Riding in the buses was another development of patience with our team members when they didn't understand the languages. We headed back to Phnom Penh safely and joyfully with a little bit less of energy.

For the fourth part of the trip, our team needed to stay at Angkor International Hotel in Phnom Penh until they left home. For the rest of our time there, we spent one day at the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, S-21, where our team members requested to visit and learn how Cambodia went through the Killing Fields. It was not an exciting place to



be, but it was a must-be place for us all to experience what Cambodians went through. We also spent another day on a trip to Choeung Ek, the site of a former orchard and mass



graves of victims of the Khmer Rouge during the Killing Fields. I know that most people, including myself, left those sites with sadness in our faces. The rest of the trip, before our team members returned home, we had a Royal boat tour trip in the evening to go through the River Front at the Royal Palace and shop for souvenirs. We had enough to rest before taking another long flight back home. This kind of trip is to engage and help Cambodian children and help the team members live a life worthy of His calling. There are more pictures from this mission trip online at comnews.org.

The fifth part was after the team members left the airport, Shirley and I went directly to the children's Center to do more ministry until the last two days before returning home. We stayed at the Center, working with our CCM staff and children. We visited more families involved in the Center and finished the house project. With CCM's staff, we prayed with a family who needed the power of our living God to remove all of the idol statues and items from his body, vehicle, house, and property. He burned all of those items. His family is now living free from the power of Satan. We cleared some trees and bushes on our property with tractor services to prepare for other projects, such as fruit trees, gardens, fish ponds, and sports areas for children and youth. We are also working on building repairs that must be fixed before another monsoon season and the next mission trip. We managed staff relationships in the Center to ensure each member knew their responsibilities and worked in unity.

There are six staff working in the Center now. We will resume classes in January after the holiday season, and the building has been fixed as needed. We set a regular Zoom meeting with CCM staff in Cambodia. Due to

their working schedule and smart devices, we still needed help with a few staff to join Zoom meetings. CCM's staff, Shirley, and I, also went to Poitpet City in Banteay Meanchey on the border of Thailand to get some good fruit trees for the Center. We checked out the source of how to get good bottled water and also visited the tour site in Veal Veng Pursath Mountains for our future mission trips. We are grateful to the Lord, who blessed our team members with good health during the trip.

For the last three days of the trip, we got back to Phnom Peng and got ready to return home. We are so glad we got home safely with many blessings from this mission trip. Thank you all for your prayers and financial support! We continue to trust God as he bestowed upon us this children's ministry with eight staff, classes during weekdays, worship services, a nutritional program, a poor family project, and maintaining property and buildings. I want to thank our church, ministry partners, and individuals who faithfully and constantly supported this ministry and enabled me to do the work of the ministry days and nights. Also, I want to thank our CCM board members,
